HYMN STORY

Christ the Lord is Risen Today

This historic anthem was written in 1739 by Charles Wesley a year after his dramatic conversion to Christianity. Wesley wrote it for the first worship service to be held in the Foundry Meeting House, which was previously a deserted iron factory in London.

It was originally named "Hymn for Easter Day" and contained 11 verses. Wesley's version did not contain the Alleluias at the end of each line. For centuries it has been associated with the tune "Easter Hymn," but that was not the music Wesley originally used with it.

The tune "Easter Hymn" first appeared in 1708 in the book Lyra Davidica (The Harp of David). History does not record who wrote the tune. Years later, an editor joined "Easter Hymn" to Wesley's words. He had to add the Alleluias at the end of each line to make it fit. One of the most famous hymns in the Christian church was the culmination of three talented people who likely never knew each other.
